

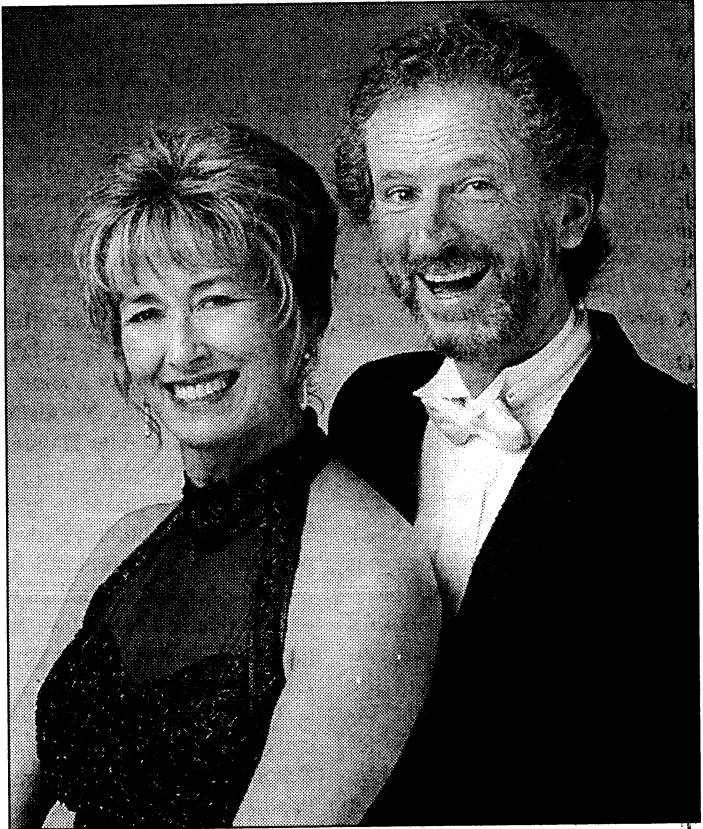
Glen Rose brings an evening of Irving Berlin

Glen Rose and Linda Day bring the music of Irving Berlin to The Upstage at 7 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, June 24-25. Anyone who enjoys Broadway will enjoy these two professional performers. Rose's tributes to the great songwriters of America began in 1996. His goal is to keep alive the classic music from that era for audiences of all ages to enjoy.

As a vehicle for his shows, Rose established a nonprofit group called the Tin Pan Alley Association, named for the New York publishing houses that distributed music in the late 1910s and early 1920s, when composers like the Gershwin brothers and Irving Berlin learned their craft.

Born into a talented Hollywood family, Rose grew up working with his father in the studio music departments of the motion picture industry with such luminaries as Johnny Williams, Nelson Riddle and Quincy Jones. In his early 20s he also worked as musical director for a variety of theater productions in Northern California and performed with the Santa Cruz Symphony for two seasons.

Rose later went on tour, entertaining on cruise ships and in hotels, resorts and nightclubs. For 10 years he performed in the cabarets of nearly every country in Western Europe. Currently he performs about 50 shows a year, returning to Santa Cruz as a home base. At home he spends

a good deal of his time leading vocal workshops for both up-and-coming and reemerging singers. He also writes jingles and has more than 100 on-air jingles to his credit.

Linda Day is a talented solo and ensemble artist who grew up in Southern California. The daughter of a jazz musician and university music professor, Day developed her singing abilities and love of the great swing era standards at a young age. She has sung in a number of choral groups.

Day has performed a variety of musical styles – from jazz to sacred to barbershop – singing in nightclubs, dinner theaters and onstage. She has recorded jingles for radio and is a vocal arranger. For the past two years, she has toured the western states as featured vocalist with Rose's Tin Pan Alley shows: The Gershwin Show, The Cole Porter Revue, The Rodgers and Hart Show and The Irving Berlin Story.
